About us.

The Scottish Business Resilience Centre (SBRC) is a non-profit organisation which exists to support and help protect Scottish Business.

Formed in 1996 the SBRC has continuously evolved to meet a changing societal and resilience landscape to provide our members and Scottish Business with the most up to date and relevant guidance and support.

SBRC operates across three main areas to provide a range of services and education, covering all aspects of business resilience 2.0 and Cyber Security.



Police Scotland and Scottish Fire and Rescue Service Secondees

SBRC has a seconded team of five police officers and one Scottish Fire and Rescue Service officer, all of whom are dedicated to providing business resilience advice, inputs and guidance to help prevent Scottish businesses become the victims of disruption, damage or financial loss through criminality or unwanted fire or fire alarm activation.

The team are at the forefront of the Prevent and Protect strand of the organisation, leading on:

- Increased collaboration between services and partners across Scotland
- Central point for Police and Fire prevent and protect communications to business
- Central point for all business resilience, crime prevention and fire risk mitigation
- Lead for the development and delivery of the Scottish Business Resilience Award

What can the seconded team do to help you?

Think of it as business crime and fire risk mitigation – the primary purpose of the seconded team is to provide the right guidance to business to help stop them becoming victims of crime or unwanted fire incidents. Effective and appropriate advice from SBRC to businesses can reduce the frontline demand on police and fire services.

The seconded team can provide input and training on the following range of topics:

- Effective Management of Legislative Fire Safety Compliance

Two of the seconded team are also Architectural Liaison Officers, trained to guide and advise on designing out crime before it can happen, from the point of the 'first brick in the ground'.

Cyber Services

Every day businesses throughout Scotland fall victim to cyber attacks or scams, which can cause significant disruption. The impacts can be considerable and long lasting, ranging from financial to loss of customer confidence.

The Scottish Business Resilience Centre provides a comprehensive range of integrated cyber security services that help business assess, build and manage their cyber security capabilities, and response to incidents and crises.

These services are designed to help businesses build confidence and understand the threats and vulnerabilities.

That's why the Scottish Business Resilience Centre and Police Scotland have produced a new leaflet which aims to give small businesses useful tips and advice on how to stay safe, secure and resilient to the threat posed by cyber crime. Cyber Security Incident Response Team

In recognition that many small and medium sized companies might not know where to turn in the event of a cyber incident, SBRC has setup a confidential Incident Response number that they can call.

The service provides free advice, guidance, and triage for cyber incidents and is supported by a cadre of Cyber Incident Response Companies across Scotland.

The service is run 09:00 to 17:00 Monday to Friday and can help with any cyber incidents including malware, ransomware, business email compromise, phishing, data loss, insider threat, account compromise.

The service can help verify cyber incidents, identify any appropriate reporting and put SMEs in contact with companies in their area who are specialists in resolving and recovering cyber incidents.

This service is run in collaboration with Police Scotland and allows for incidents to be directed to the police where and when appropriate.
